MEETING IN MADRID





During the visit, intensive training was held covering visual arts, various art forms, modern digital tools used in museums and working with children.

The meeting was not only an opportunity to continue working together on the project, but also to discuss all the additional aspects between the partner schools in the field of museum education and the various methods of presentation.






February 24-28 - Espacio Rojo, Madrid, Spain

In addition to the financial aspect of the project, the project partners also had the opportunity to get to know Madrid better; its architecture, history and culture. An important integration element was the discovery of the local cuisine, which allowed a better understanding of Spanish traditions and customs.



At the end of the meeting, current issues related to the implementation of the project were discussed. These included the organizational structure, future activities and the structure and content of the new website that will guide the project. The meeting in Madrid was not only productive in terms of content, but also inspiring and strengthening international cooperation.

PRADO MUSEUM



The Prado Museum was officially opened to the public in Madrid in 1819. Originally called the Royal Museum of Painting and Sculpture, its main purpose was to make the royal art collection available to the public. The main responsibility for the museum's establishment lies with King Ferdinand VII, who had a great interest in art, and his wife, Queen Maria Isabella of Braganza. It was she who came up with the idea of establishing a national art gallery.



The building where the museum is located was designed by the famous architect Juan de Villanueva in the 18th century. Originally built for scientific purposes, the building was later converted into an art gallery.

The Prado Museum's collection today includes over 8,000 paintings, most of which are masterpieces of Spanish, Italian and Flemish painting. The museum is famous for its works by masters such as Diego Velázquez, Francisco Goya, Hieronymus Bosch, El Greco and Peter Paul Rubens.


The Prado has undergone numerous modernizations and expansions over the years, becoming one of the most important and visited museums in the world. Today, it is not only a treasury of European art, but also a symbol of Spain's cultural identity.
